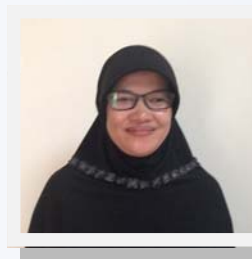

School Attendance

With the commencement of a new school year I would like to remind all families of the importance of students attending school every day. Regular attendance at school is a major contributor to academic and social/emotional success. Students who attend school regularly have a greater chance of achieving to their full potential and being socially connected.

If we were to calculate the impact on a child missing school one day per week this would add up to:

41 days per year or 8 weeks for the year

Over a 5 year period this would equal one entire year of school missed.

Regular absences such as this can cause significant disadvantage to a child's opportunities in life. Attending school every school day for the whole day enables students to participate in the school's educational program as well as develop their social skills. Every day at school is an important learning day.

Please ensure your child attends school regularly to give them the best opportunity for a successful future. **If your child is ill and unable to attend school please contact your child's Campus Office to inform us.**

9:00am start

It is important that your child is at school by 9:00am every day as all lessons commence at this time. If your child is consistently late to school they will miss important learning time. We want our students to have every opportunity to learn by being at school on time, ready to learn, every day. Thank you for your attention to this.

All our students have a folder which is kept in our office that contains their CAP's plan, a current resume, certificates, job skill checklists and more. It is the student's responsibility to keep their plans and their portfolio up to date.

Last year, Benalla P-12 College received wonderful news that we were one out of 16 schools throughout Australia who had been selected to be part of the Australia-Indonesia BRIDGE School Partnerships Project. Through this project, Benalla P-12 College now has an official sister school relationship with **SMP Kristen Citra Bangsa, Kupang, East Nusa Tenggara Indonesia**. Our sister school is located in the most eastern point of Indonesia. Both schools, teachers and students are extremely excited about the opportunities of this relationship.

The project supports Indonesian language learning and studies in Australian schools and strengthens intercultural understanding between the two schools, students, staff and the wider community.

On March 5th, 18 students and 3 staff members, including our sister school's Principal, will be arriving in Benalla to commence their exchange. They will be involved in a range of activities daily at all of the campuses. This is an amazing opportunity for all of us to embrace.

We are seeking host families for the **18 students from March 5 until March 17**. The students are in Year 8-9. As a host, you would be required to provide their daily meals and accommodation. They will be really happy to be involved with you and your families extra-curricular activities. As a host family, you essentially become that student's parents and family not only for the time they are in your home, but you will often find that this maybe for the rest of your life.

These students will be involved in classes and the teachers will team teach alongside the Indonesian staff at our school. Further to this, our sister school will also be involved in Indonesian Rotations at Avon St Campus as well as Bush Walks, time in the Stephanie Alexander Program and lots more.

We would love to ensure that the teachers and students access a broad range of activities at the College and have a rich experience living in Benalla. We know that they would love to experience various homestays in Benalla or in outlying areas.

A TASTE OF SOMETHING DIFFERENT

Dear parents

At our school we aim to create a safe and supportive school community for everyone.

Sometimes, it can be difficult for parents or carers to know what to do when their child talks to them about bullying.

You are an important part of our work to prevent bullying and to respond effectively if it happens. Stopping bullying involves everyone.

1. If your child talks to you about bullying:

Listen calmly and get the full story. Your calm response is important to allow your child to tell you all about the situation. After they've told you their story, ask questions to get more details if you need to: who, what, where, when. Although you may feel some strong emotions about your child's experience, try to keep calm to avoid more distress to your child.

If your child talks to you about bullying:

1. **Listen** calmly and get the full story.
2. **Reassure** your child that they are not to blame.
3. **Ask** your child what they want to do about it and how you can help.
4. **Visit** www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find some strategies.
5. **Contact** the school.
6. **Check in** regularly with your child.

2. Reassure your child they are not to blame. Many children blame themselves and this may make them feel even worse. You could say things like, 'That sounds really hard to deal with. No one should have to put up with that.' or 'I'm so glad you told me. You should be able to feel safe at school; that's not fair at all'.

3. Ask your child what they want to do and what they want you to do. A critical part of your response is to avoid jumping in to solve the problem. While it is natural to want to protect your child, helping them to find their own solution is a better option. It helps them feel they have some power in the situation.

4. Visit www.bullyingnoway.gov.au to find some strategies. The website has tips and ideas for different bullying situations. One idea is to practise strategies at home to help your child feel more confident.

5. Contact the school. Your child may be reluctant for you to do this, so discuss the idea and reassure them that the school would want to know and is able to help. Make an appointment to meet with your child's teacher and, if you need to, ask to talk with the principal. Contact the school immediately if you have a concern about your child's safety.

6. Check in regularly with your child. Keep the conversation going. It can take time to resolve issues, so check in regularly with your child about their experiences and their feelings. Your ongoing support is important.
