School Council Elections

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Benalla P-12 College's School Council is comprised of 8 Parent Members, 5 DET (Department of Education and Training) Members and 2 Community Members.

School Councillors are elected for a two-year term. School council must meet at least 8 times in each year, and at least once per school term

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel an greater sense of belonging.

This year there are 6 Parent Member positions vacant and 2 DET member positions vacant.

Finger Pointing Under Words When Reading

It is important that early readers finger point under the words, to match what is read aloud with the printed words on the page. The finger pointing acts as a check for accuracy.

Eventually, the finger pointing will decrease, as the child is able to follow the text with his or her eyes. A child may return to finger pointing when a word is tricky or when the text is difficult. The child will then use learnt strategies to solve a new word or reread to self-check what has been read



My hands have jobs when I read.

If I write with my right hand-

My right hand points under the word as I read it.

My **left** hand holds the book flat on the table so it doesn't move.

If I write with my **left** hand, my hands have different jobs when I read.

My *left* hand points under the word as I read it.

My right hand holds the book flat on the table so it doesn't move.

School Vaccination Program: Benalla P-12 College

The first round of school vaccinations is being conducted at this school on Friday 3 March 2017.

The following vaccines will be offered on this day:

These vaccinations are funded on the National Immunisation Schedule. Should your child miss out on starting their vaccination course this year they will not be eligible to receive them for free in subsequent years.

Parent information packs were sent home recently.

The consent card (Part A) must be completed, signed and returned to the school even if your child is not being vaccinated.

To consent to your child being vaccinated with one or more vaccines, please tick and sign the relevant YES sections of the consent card. If you DO NOT wish to have your child vaccinated with one or more vaccines or if your child has already been vaccinated, please tick the relevant NO section on the consent card and return them to the school by Friday 17 February 2017. Please return the card to the school even if your child is not being vaccinated.



Payment of Accounts – Accounts for Vacation Care have been distributed this week. Payment can be made directly to the campus school office by cash, cheque, money order or Eftpos. Credit card details can also be taken over the phone, directly to the campus office. Payment plans, where fees are paid in instal-

ments, are available and must be negotiated directly with the Campus Principal, or representative.

Ezidebit - From 2017, families will have the option to sign up to Ezidebit, a direct debit payment system that offers a fully automatic direct debit solution that allows for the collection of recurring fees, variable amounts, invoice payments or payment plan amounts from the customers' bank, building society, credit union or credit card and debit card accounts. In order to use Ezidebit's Direct Debit Payment System families must authorise the debiting of their account (debit or credit) and provide details of the amount, start date, frequency and the nominated debit account. Forms for Ezidebit have been posted with accounts to families, which can be returned to the school office for processing.
