School Council Elections

All government schools in Victoria have a school council. They are legally constituted bodies that are given powers to set the key directions of a school within statewide guidelines. In doing this, a school council is able to directly influence the quality of education that the school provides for its students.

Benalla P-12 College's School Council is comprised of 8 Parent Members, 5 DET (Department of Education and Training) Members and 2 Community Members.

School Councillors are elected for a two-year term. School council must meet at least 8 times in each year, and at least once per school term

Parents on school councils provide important viewpoints and have valuable skills that can help shape the direction of the school. Those parents who become active on a school council find their involvement satisfying in itself and may also find that their children feel an greater sense of belonging.

This year there are 6 Parent Member positions vacant and 2 DET member positions vacant.





The first round of school vaccinations is being conducted at this school on Friday 3 March 2017.

These vaccinations are funded on the National Immunisation Schedule. Should your child miss out on starting their vaccination course this year they will not be eligible to receive them for free in subsequent years.

Parent information packs were sent home recently.

The consent card (Part A) must be completed, signed and returned to the school even if your child is not being vaccinated.

To consent to your child being vaccinated with one or more vaccines, please tick and sign the relevant YES sections of the consent card. If you **DO NOT** wish to have your child vaccinated with one or more vaccines or if your child has already been vaccinated, please tick the relevant NO section on the consent card and return them to the school by Friday 17 February 2017. Please return the card to the school even if your child is not being vaccinated.

On the 15th of February 2017, 19 Yr 12 VET Sport & Rec students from Benalla P-12 College were crawling out of bed before the sun had presented on the horizon. It was time for the annual pilgrimage to Torquay for three days of frivolity in the surf and on the beach.

The class headed off down the Hume Freeway for the four hour bus trip to the Torquay Surf Life Saving Club. As soon as we arrived, students went straight into conducting their own sport & recreation beach sessions with the rest of the class. Prior to going on the camp, each Sport & Rec student developed their own beach activity that they would conduct on the beach. Some of the sessions students planned to take included beach cricket, ultimate Frisbee, touch rugby, flag races and beach soccer. Writing in Maths

When students are working in Maths, they often think that there is no connection with other subjects they are studying; "it's all about numbers and getting the right answer!" is often heard. On the contrary, there is lots of overlap with many other disciplines. It all depends on how hard you look.

In this year 10 Maths class, I asked students to write a piece to describe the sequence of events that they would follow to arrive at the final answer. It might seem trivial, but it certainly focusses the attention on how someone would explain their answer to others. The writing component highlights a typical sequence genre for following directions or following instructions.

This is quite a good example of the genre written for a Maths class; who said that subjects don't collide.
