



On the 5<sup>th</sup> March, 18 students and 3 staff from the Benalla P-12 College sister school – SMP Kristen Citra Bangsa, including Ibu Tince, Ibu Surya and School Principal, Jublina Ga arrived in Benalla. This is the first time such a large contingent of exchange students have been welcomed into the Benalla P-12 College community.

Students, staff and families at Benalla P-12 College had been eagerly anticipating the arrival of the exchange students since last year and the results of this visit will be endless for both the students involved, Benalla P-12 College staff as well as the wider community. All 21 Indonesian guests have been hosted by families and staff from the College.

Benalla P-12 College Principal, Barbara O'Brien has been thrilled with the visit by the Indonesian Sister School. She commented that this is a wonderful way to develop intercultural understanding and to learn how to work with our closest neighbours, speak each other's languages, and understand our similarities and differences. This relationship will enable our students, staff, school families and broader community to develop meaningful and long-lasting people to people connections.

Whilst in Benalla, the exchange students have been involved in several wonderful activities. The exchange students were formerly welcomed by Mayor Don Firth and Benalla P-12 College Principal Barbara O'Brien at an official Welcome Ceremony. They have also been involved in classes with the Years 3-7 students at the college, as well as intercultural trips to Winton Wetlands led by Anita Larkin, an indigenous art class led by Judy Schwartzman, a trip to Healesville Sanctuary with the Year 8 Indonesian students, as well as trips to Glenrowan, around Benalla and Beechworth. Students from the Indonesian Language Academy ran a successful Australian Cooking workshop with the students, which resulted in even closer relationships being made between the students.

The students have commented several times how amazing their host families have been and they have been equally amazed by the beautiful welcome they have had into the Benalla Community. Host families and students are certainly not looking forward to the goodbyes on the 16th March, however, Heidi believes that many students are already planning their return as well as Benalla P-12 College families, students and staff are planning their first trip to Kupang, Indonesia.


## Southern Ranges Swimming

#### **Method of Payment**

Payment can be made directly to the campus school office by cash, cheque, money order or Eftpos. Credit card details can also be taken over the phone, directly to the campus office. Payment plans, where fees are paid in instalments, are available and must be negotiated directly with the Campus Principal, or representative. From 2017, families will have the option to sign up to Ezidebit, a direct debit payment system that offers a fully automatic direct debit solution that allows for the collection of recurring fees or payment plan amounts from the customers' bank, building society, credit union or credit card and debit card accounts. In order to use Ezidebit's Direct Debit Payment System families must authorise the debiting of their account (debit or credit) and provide details of the amount, start date, frequency and the nominated debit account. 
