#### Parent / Teacher / Student Interviews

Parent / Teacher / Student Interviews provide an important time when families can speak to their child's teacher to discuss academic progress and social emotional development. We value family members' knowledge about their children and this meeting can help us to learn more about each child and how we can support them in their school life. Your child is required to attend the Parent/Teacher interviews to be part of the discussion about their learning with you and their teacher.

Interview times are to be booked through the online booking system which is available to all parents. Full instructions on booking are being sent home with your child, however, if you are experiencing difficulties please contact your child's campus. Parents/guardians who are unable to make a booking electronically will be able to arrange an interview time with your child's teacher.



We look forward to seeing all parents and students at the interviews. Students are not required at school on Friday 25<sup>th</sup> August.

#### **Parent Opinion Survey**




### **Everyday Counts**

### Why it's important

We all want our students to get a great education, and the building blocks for a great education begin with students coming to school each and every day. If students miss school regularly, they miss out on learning the fundamental skills that will set them up for success in the later years of school. There is no safe number of days for missing school – each day a student misses puts them behind, and can affect their educational outcomes. Each missed day is associated with progressively lower achievement in numeracy, writing and reading.










### **Woolworths Earn & Learn**

### OSHCS Fees Policy – Approved by school council

The following is an extract from the current OSHCS fees policy. If you are using the program, please ensure that you are familiar with your payment obligations to the school.

#### Payment of Accounts

Fees will be invoiced to families at the end of each month. Payment of the account needs to be made within 30 days. If the invoice is not paid by the end of the term, then the Approved Provider has the right to withdraw any further care for the child until the account is paid. Families who have not paid for Vacation Care, will not be able to submit a request for care for the following Vacation period, until the outstanding invoice is fully paid.

If parents/guardians are experiencing financial hardship, they should contact the Campus Principal or representative, to discuss payment options and negotiate if any further care can be provided.
