



Last Monday and Tuesday all of our Prep to Year 6 students participated in a first aid course designed for students.

The course was run by St John's Ambulance Victoria. The students used the D,R,S,A,B,C action plan to learn how to provide first aid.

The Preps, Year 1 and 2 students learnt how to help someone by: D – checking for danger, R – checking if person can respond and S – how to send for help.

They also learnt some simple actions that would help in the case of a blood nose, a burn, a snakebite and how to use a mobile phone to call 000.

The Year 3/4s ex-

panded their knowledge of providing first aid when a person is unconscious by learning how to check if the person had clear airways, if they were breathing and how to place them in a recovery positon.

The Year 5/6s talked about D (danger), R (response), S (send for help), A (airways), B (breathing) and then practised performing CPR.

The students gained some very important information about how they can help in a situation where someone needed first aid.




#### **Maths Talent Quest**

### **Creativity in Year 8 Learning Space**



This semester, the Year 8's have undertaken a new science unit; Biology. Throughout the unit they learnt that cells are essential building blocks of life, identified organelles, their respective functions and the difference between plant and animal cells.

To aid their learning, the students were tasked with creating a 3D model of either a plant or animal cell using common materials. Their models were submitted with an accompanying table that included the functions of the organelles in order to consolidate their learning.

Some of the 3D models were edible like cakes and pizza whilst some constructed cells using materials like playdough, styrofoam, wool, pipe cleaners and string.

- Upon completion of the Diploma, students will be eligible for entry into the Bachelor of Sports Coaching and Development at La Trobe University, Bundoora with advanced standing (credit) for the first year of the course.

#### School Bus Management System

In the lead up to the 2019 school year, all travellers wishing to access School Bus Program services, are required to login to the School Bus Management System and submit their travel applications.

The school wishes to stress to parents that safety is our number one priority. If your child is not registered and is still travelling on a bus, then the School Bus Management System and our school records will not have them listed to catch the bus. In the event of an incident or a need to stop the bus, we will not know that firstly your child is on the bus and will not know to contact you.


To login to the School Bus Management System, please go to https:\\schoolbusapplication.ptv.vic.gov.au. **Existing Travellers** 

These are students who already travel on the school bus and are registered on the School Bus Management System. If your child requires continued travel on the school bus, then you must submit a 2019 travel application.

The chart below will help families already registered on the School Bus Management System to:

- Renew Applications If your child is already travelling and needs continued school bus access and has not changed school or home address
- Add Travellers and New Application If you are already registered on the School Bus Management System, but have a child accessing a bus for the first time
- New Application If your child is already travelling but has changed school or home address.




Diagram 2 - New Traveller

#### Child Care Subsidy set up.

The change over to the new Child Care Subsidy, has been a time consuming task for both the school and families. While we have been working hard to contact families to ensure the set up is complete, there are still a few families who have not completed all the tasks to be assessed for CCS, which then provides a reduction in cost of the care, depending on entitlements.

#### Steps for families to follow include:

Complete the Centrelink Activity test

Receive an email from our software (Xplor), create password for log in. Carers can generate the email.

Log into Xplor with your password and electronically sign the Client Written Agreement (CWA), this is required if you are claiming CCS. This confirms your understanding of fees etc

Log into your Centrelink App on your phone, or computer, go to CCS, Enrolments and **CONFIRM** the enrolments.

Check with the After School Care staff, to ensure the CCS is now working

**PAYMENT** – Log back into Xplor using your password, check your account balance and enter your bank account details. This will debit your account each week and pay as you use the service. This will soon be our preferred method of payment, however at present, payment can still be made at the school office.
