#### A MESSAGE FROM OUR PRINCIPAL

#### **School Council**

This time of year always marks the time when School Council elections are held. The March council meeting is our AGM and also is the start of the new School Council for the coming year. As with all School Councils, there is a mix of parent reps, staff reps and community reps who are co-opted. There are also two student reps who attend council meetings with full voting rights.

For this round of elections there are the following vacancies – 4 parents, 2 staff and 1 student. Notice of election and call for nomination posters have been placed at every campus office along with the necessary forms.

I would encourage every parent to consider standing for School Council. It involves only 8 meetings per year, each one lasting 90 minutes on Monday evenings at 5.30pm. It is a great way to be involved in the school and to see how and why decisions are made, as well as contribute to important policy development for the effective running of the College.

If you are even remotely interested, please give me a call or stop me for a chat if you see me at school. Nominations close on March 4<sup>th</sup>.

#### **Annual Implementation Plan**

As mentioned last year, we have a clear plan each year that sets out our goals, targets and priorities for improvement. This is called our AIP (Annual Implementation Plan). This document will be presented to School Council and ratified at the upcoming February meeting. Our key improvement strategies for this year are:

- Agreed and consistent whole school approaches to teaching and learning.
- Professional Learning Communities to build teacher capacity in all curriculum areas F-12

We also intend to maintain our focus on high expectations and our Schoolwide Positive Behaviour Support Framework to ensure a positive learning environment. We have very clear expectations of all our students of their behaviour, attendance and the uniform they wear to school every day. Please help support us as we try to enforce these consistently to ensure we have a school we can all be proud of

#### **Attendance**

Some of you may have noticed that we are now following the DET guidelines for attendance monitoring by calling home on the first day of a student absence and sending home letters on the third day of unexplained absence. School attendance is a not only essential for learning it is a legal requirement and parents must provide an explanation for any absences. Please support us and your child by ensuring they attend school every day and also that they arrive on time. The start of the day is very important for all students and getting to school on time develops good habits of punctuality and reliability.

## FAITHFULL ST CAMPUS NEWS

#### MATHS MATES YRS 7-10

This year, as part of their Mathematics program, all Year 7-10 students will be given a Maths Mate homework sheet on a weekly basis. There will be eight worksheets to be completed each term, usually one per week, except on short or disrupted weeks.

The Maths Mate worksheets are designed to allow students to attempt all questions without the aid of a calculator, and this should be encouraged at home.

Don't be too concerned if your child finds the first worksheet difficult. It is not expected that students will be able to complete every question from week one; in fact Q33 has been included to offer a real challenge to all students. Each worksheet is built around a common framework of questions aimed at covering the Australian Mathematics Curriculum.

Students will receive the same type of question on a regular basis. Their results will help students and teachers identify areas of strength and weakness. This should also help motivate students to make another attempt at mastering skills that they may have found difficult in the past. If your child is having difficulty with a certain skill, teachers will provide them with resources to help build their skills.

We ask that you sign the completed worksheet each week to acknowledge that your child is working independently and regularly but with your support. We thank you in anticipation of your involvement and remind you that you are encouraged to call and discuss your child's progress at any time.

Last week Cathy Hair and Deb Paez spoke to all our Year 9 students about two great opportunities offered by the Tomorrow:Today Foundation. Two current Year 10 students, Zoe Thomson and Andre McLean-Frankling, also explained activities undertaken in these programs and why they would recommend them to all Year 9s.

<u>Connect9</u> - This is a 10 week community-based program that has lots of fun activities. Each student is given an adult mentor who helps them to connect with the Benalla Community and learn about new sports, hobbies and skills. Students can enrol in Term 2 or Term 3.

Term 2 program runs on Tuesday nights 5.30 - 7pm from 23 April to 25 June.

Term 3 runs on Wednesday nights from 17 July to 18 September.

#### Registrations due by Wednesday 27 February

<u>Paid Part-time Work</u> - This is a 5 week program which gives students work-readiness skills and provides them with an opportunity to meet local employers. Students can enrol in Term 2 or Term 3. Term 2 program runs from Wednesday nights **4 - 7.30pm** from 29 May to 26 June and Term 3 program runs on Tuesday nights from 20 August to 17 September.

- Students can enrol in both programs but it is not recommended that students do both in the same term


