School Council

Nominations closed last week and there were 3 nominations for 4 parent positions. The nominations were from Year 12 student Willow Plex and Year 11 student Arnica Stanley. Voting closes this Thursday and the ballot will be declared on Friday.

Students Leaving School Grounds

At Faithfull Street there have been a number of incidents where students have left the school grounds without permission. We have a duty of care to all students while they are at school and this means that they must remain on-site unless an excursion or activity with a teacher takes them out. We also have a canteen that sells a wide range of foods so there is no need to leave school to purchase food elsewhere. Please support us by ensuring that your child understands this rule and that there are consequences if it is broken.

Compass

We have introduced a new school management system this year called Compass. It is used by staff for a wide range of reasons and will soon be made available to parents to complete some important functions. If you can attend, please do so, otherwise you will receive log-in information in the mail very soon. Booking Parent-Teacher Interviews will be the first opportunity for you to try out the new system.

CSEF

Why every day counts

With only 4 weeks to go until the end of term, there are only 19 days of school left. Hasn't the term flown by. Until the end of term, teachers will be busy writing up student's reports. This can reflect your child's attendance, if they are up to date with their school work requirements and how their absences have affected their learning. Have you spoken with your child's teacher and organised work while they have been absent so they can catch up?

What does your child miss out on if they are not at school? They miss out on all the big stuff-class discussions and all the interaction that happens in the classroom, the chance to get help form teachers and the opportunity to practice skills and gain knowledge. Being away means you might miss out on a lot of learning or that you need to catch up in your own time.

If all that isn't enough to convince you to get your child to school every day, being away also means they miss out on playing their friends. Being away from school can be lonely. It has a big impact on relationships and social connections. Believe it or not, everyone wants your child to be at school and it really is better when they attend.

1- <u>Research</u> careers and courses through the VTAC website and my future.com and help your child wade through the endless amounts of information. Look at TAFE/VOCATIONAL pathways and local learning and job opportunities.



- 2- **Encourage** your child prepare a portfolio that has everything it. This includes an up to date resume.
- 3- Encourage your child to <u>volunteer.</u> Unpaid work is one of the best ways to gain valuable experience and develop employability skills. Volunteering and community work is a great way for them to add experience to their resume.
- 4- **Take opportunities.** Encourage your child to take advantage of everything that is offered to them, whether that be excursions, volunteering and school involvement opportunities or work experience.
- 5- RESEARCH indicates that PARENTS are the single greatest influence on their child's education and CAREER decision making. High parental engagement can have a major impact on your child's learning and aspirations. We greatly value working with parents and guardians to help us support our students. We encourage you to attend careers interviews with your child.

What will the jobs market be like in 2020 and beyond?

- Jobs creation will be a reflection of Australia's projected increase in population and the impact of the aging population on healthcare and changing technologies.

BENALLA P-12 STREET ARTISTS SELECTED




