Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of the Benalla P-12 College Community,

As we start the first full week of remote learning 2.0, I hope you are all managing well and getting the support you need. It is going to be a tough time again but we can all do this and get through it ok. There are plenty of people here at school who can support you if you need it, so please get in touch if you do.

Here is a reminder of what students should be doing during the day for remote learning:

- **P-4 students**: complete each days work as set out in the hardcopy pack sent home last Friday. About 45 minutes literacy (reading, writing and spelling), 30 minutes of maths and daily PE. There will also be weekly specialist activities to do Art and Indonesian.
- **5-6 students:** log on to Google Classroom each day and see the work set for that day. Reading, writing, spelling/grammar as well as maths. There will also be some daily PE and specialist activities such as Art, Music and Indonesian.
- **7-12 students:** all secondary students should follow their normal timetable and log on to each lesson to have attendance recorded. Work will be sent out via Google Classroom and may be accompanied by slides of information, pre-recorded videos and in some cases, live videoconferencing with the teacher.

All students should be receiving feedback on one piece of assessment every week for each class by the teacher. All students should also be trying as much as possible to develop and maintain a routine at home which includes eating well, exercising and getting plenty of sleep.

PRINCIPALS MESSAGE CONTINUED......

Online safety - Staff have been spoken to about ensuring they are maintaining safe online environments for students and themselves. Parents can support these safe environments too in a number of ways:

- Ensure students are set up in an area of the home where they can be supervised.
- Making sure students are dressed appropriately for online sessions.
- Encouraging appropriate online behaviour.

Temperature Testing – last week I posted on Compass that we would be temperature screening all students coming on-site for daily supervision. This is a quick and non-intrusive procedure that helps identify fever, which can be a symptom of COVID-19. This will continue every day until further notice.

VCE students – some of you may have heard the Minister for Education, James Merlino, announce on Friday that the VCAA would be implementing some changes to support students in Year 12 and those completing a Unit 3/4 subject this year. There are no details as yet but it was proposed that all students would receive special consideration in light of the disruptions this year, to ensure that their end of year results are a fair and accurate reflection of their effort.

Technology – we have distributed over 200 devices to students and families, including laptops, iPads and internet dongles. Secondary students in particular need a device to work from, so if you have not yet arranged one for your child please get in touch.

Course Counselling for 2021

Current Year 10 and 11 students need to have parent/carer/student/Counsellor meetings to discuss and submit their 2021 Course on Wednesday August 12. Please book these on compass. Interviews will be conducted either by phone or WebEx (you decide). There are recorded Powerpoints on 'Course Information' and 'How to complete the paperwork' as well as spare selection sheets and speed dating Powerpoints for Year 10 into 11 all on your Year Level Google Classrooms. Please make sure you are prepared for your meetings. In preparation for your meeting you need to email your counsellor a copy of your selection sheets along with your preferred method of meeting by the end of Tuesday August 11.

Please note—Wednesday August 12 is no longer a pupil free day so you also need to log in to each of your classes, answer the attendance question and complete the work assigned.

Tips For Remote Learning

- 1. Staying organized and having a strong routine are crucial. Structure your day like a normal school day. You need to log in to your subject Google Classrooms at the start of each lesson and answer the attendance question. This is how we are marking the roll this time so this is critical for your attendance.
- 2. Set up a space where you can work uninterrupted.
- 3. Have a recess and lunch break at the school time and in this break try to get a bit of exercise/fresh air.
- 4. Look after your well being. Make sure you connect with your friends and have some fun.
- 5. Constant media coverage can keep you in a heightened state of anxiety—try to limit related media exposure and focus on factual information from reliable, trustworthy sources of information.

IMPORTANT 2021 COURSE SELECTION INFORMATION

Dear Parents/Carers,

Due to the stage 3 COVID-19 restrictions in place, we are unable to hold the Course Counselling interviews onsite as planned for Wednesday August 12. Instead, we will hold them either via WebEx or by phone. It is critical that this process goes ahead to ensure your child has the correct course for 2021.

Completing this work remotely is not ideal, however we have endeavoured to provide as much assistance as possible. You and your child need to make sure you do the following in preparation for counselling:

- Read the Senior School Course Handbook 2021 available on the website and Year Level Google Classroom.
- Watch the Course Information Session Power point available on the Year Level Google Classroom
- Current Year 10 and 11 students watch the Paperwork Power point on the Year Level Google Classroom
- Research possible careers and pathways
- Complete all paperwork
- Log on to Compass and make an appointment time with the designated Course Counsellors for Wednesday August 12
- Send an email to the Course Counsellor prior to Wednesday with the completed selection sheet attached (you can either take a photo or scan it) and your preferred method of meeting (via WebEx or speaker phone).
 - Teachers will then send the link to the WebEx meeting. At your appointment time, please click on the link provided. Please ensure you <u>do not enter before your allocated time</u> as you will interrupt another families' meeting. Keep in mind we will also have to finish at the appropriate time to allow for this process.
 - Please provide the preferred mobile number if the meeting is via phone.

Please note that the day is no longer classified as a Year 9 to 11 pupil free day so students will need to log on to their Google Classrooms as per a normal school day.

What is VET in the VCE?

VET stands for Vocational Education and Training, and vocation refers to work or employment. VET in the VCE programs are designed to give students an exposure to practical skills and an understanding of what it is like to 'learn through doing'. So,

students can opt to do a VET subject while completing their VCE and, in most cases, the VET qualification contributes towards the VCE and the ATAR.

- If you can't remember your timetable reach out to your coordinator.




SIGN IN EACH DAY

- IT help can be accessed by emailing helpdesk@benallap12.vic.edu.au




SUBMITTING WORK
