Return to School

As mentioned last week, teachers will be completing different assessments to determine where students are at with their learning so that we can plan for 'catch -up' learning as required.

COVID Safe Plan

Some good news for music students last week, with the DET updating the guidelines around instrumental lessons. Brass and woodwind lessons are allowed to go ahead now as long as they are held outside. Instrumental music staff David Roe and Barry Roberts have set up some practice spaces in front of the PAC and students can be heard playing from across the yard.

The requirement to wear a face mask is still in place for all staff and secondary students. The vast majority of students are being very responsible and complying with this rule. They are allowed to remove it for PE classes and while eating and drinking, and can take short breaks if permitted by the teacher. Who knows how long this requirement will last for but at the moment it is important that we all comply and wear them appropriately. This applies to parents dropping off and collecting students from school.

Positive Behaviours

Over remote learning we had a focus on acknowledging positive behaviours in students. This seemed to make a difference in the level of engagement for students with online learning. It is pleasing to see that this has continued and staff have been acknowledging students on Compass with positive notices. Well done to all those students who have been receiving these awards for demonstrating school values and expected behaviours during lessons.



YEARS 10-12 NEWS -FAITHFULL STREET CAMPUS

The Australian Business and Community Network (ABCN) have partnered with Benalla P-12 College to run a program, this term, called Digital Aspirations.

Students from Year 11 and 10 have chosen to be a part of this great online opportunity. The program has an employability and enterprise focus, broadening students' awareness of post-school career pathways and giving them the best opportunity to develop the skills for life after school.

The students are being mentored by business professionals from the law firm Hall & Wilcox allowing the students to find out more about personal, education and vocation choices.

Teen Mental Health First Aid (TMHFA): What students need to know

Benalla P-12 College is conducting TMHFA training for the Year 8 cohort, which gives young people the skills they need to recognise and help with mental health problems and crises in their friends, and to get the help of an adult quickly.

This course isn't happening because of any specific problems at Benalla P-12 College.

Young people will often turn to each other when stressed or upset, and try to help each other, and sometimes take too much on. This course teaches you not to try to take on these problems alone, and when you should get an adult involved. You won't be talking about any problems you are having yourself and you won't learn to give therapy or diagnose a problem.

The course discusses different types of mental health crises, including suicidal thoughts. Some people may find it distressing. Talk to your parents about it if you're worried that talking about crisis situations will make it too hard for you to be a part of the course. However, you should be aware that most people find that even if they have lost someone to suicide, the information in the course makes them feel better, not worse.

Session 1 (October 14th) discusses mental health problems in general, and understanding how common and tough these are in young people.

Session 2 (October 22nd) talks about helping a friend who is in crisis, whether because they are suicidal, engaging in nonsuicidal self-injury, or experiencing bullying or abuse.

The Action Plan ('Look, Ask, Listen, Help Your Friend') is introduced for the first time, and there is a video demonstrating how someone could offer support to a friend.

Session 3 (October 30th) In this session you will practice using the ACTION PLAN so you feel prepared to help a friend in need. We won't teach you how to diagnose problems – it's advice about being a supportive friend, encouraging your friend to seek help, and knowing when it's time to get someone else involved.

You will take your manual home after session 3. There are resources for further information in the back and you may want to explore them alone or with your parents. If you wish to learn more now, resources are also provided overleaf. **If you wish to learn more...**
