Dear Parents, Carers and Friends of the Benalla P-12 College Community,

Every Day Counts – you would have heard this before, and it is very true for all children when it comes to school. Each day a child learns new and important things, including skills and knowledge in specific curriculum areas, as well as social and emotional skills to help them be successful in life.

Since we have returned to face to face schooling, we have seen a pattern of students missing days of school. At the moment the message is that if students are unwell they should stay home, and we greatly appreciate the support that parents are providing in this area. If your child is well, please make sure they attend school every day on time and that they stay for the full day. This way they will get the full benefit of being in their class learning.

Some of you may have heard about the DETs proposed plan to employ 'retired teachers' in 2021 to support students who fell behind during remote learning. This is going to happen and is called the 'Tutor Program'. Each school receives funding to employ additional teachers to work in classes with small groups of students to help them 'catch up. We have been allocated funding and will now begin the process of employing teachers for this important work. Many of our students will benefit from this extra support, along with the other support and intervention programs we are offering.

Another focus next year will be the health and wellbeing of all students – both physical and mental. One of the outcomes of two extended periods of remote learning is that many children and teenagers were much less active than they normally would be. Providing opportunities for students to undertake additional physical activity will be a focus for us next year.

I hope you are all enjoying the slow and steady return to normality of life. Things keep changing and we are allowed to do more things at school, so will keep you updated if anything changes this week.



SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE FOR CURRENT YEAR 10 and 11 STUDENTS

Current Year 10s:

<u>Weary Dunlop Memorial Scholarship</u> – valued at \$2000 to assist with school fees, books, excursions and other curricular needs. Students applying need to be committed to completing their Year 11 and 12 studies. Both males and females can apply.

<u>CWA Scholarship</u> – for female students who are committed to completing Years 11 and 12. Scholarship is valued at \$1500 and can be used to pay for things such as books, clothing, shoes, camps and excursions.

Current Year 11s:

<u>The Grace and Albert Stolz Scholarship</u> – available for both males and females to apply for are committed to completing VCE and the proceeding to tertiary studies. School and community involvement is a determining factor. Scholarship is valued at \$1500 for assistance with completing Year 12.

Virtual Work Experience Expo 2.0 for secondary students in Years 9 & 10

On Tuesday 24 November, 500 Year 9 and 10 students from across North East Victoria will participate in free, online interactive sessions with local industry representatives.

The event aims to build industry and community connections by engaging in different ways to raise awareness of post school options, different career pathways and highlight the breadth of career opportunities across the region. To also articulate skills that young people will require when they enter the workforce, showcase growing industries and where the future jobs are.

The virtual initiative has been well supported by schools across the North East Region as students have not been able to undertake the 'normal' work experience placement in industry due to COVID.


This regionally based collaborative initiative is led by Charles Sturt University and NE Tracks LLEN, partnering with LLEN regions including Goulburn Murray LLEN, NELLEN, East Gippsland LLEN, local industry and community organisations.

From 9am – 12.30pm, students will have an opportunity to choose 5 different industry streams including: Food & Fibre, Health, Trades (Carpentry, Hairdressing & Auto), Essential Services (Police, CFA & SES) and Arts / Creative (IT, Graphic Design & Events). The interactive webinars will run for 30 minutes and industry experts will share what their job involves, the skills needed to carry out their job, the future of the industry and advice they would give to anyone interested in getting into the industry.

The industry speakers represent a broad range of industries based on previous student feedback. Industry representatives have been sourced from identified industry growth areas where there will be ongoing future workforce demand.

This is the second virtual work experience event to be held in 2020. The first was held in June with 578 students from nine secondary schools and 40 industry representatives involved. Post event, students described the experience as educational, relevant, and practical.

The virtual events have been designed to encourage ongoing career conversations and the exploration of possible future pathways between students and Careers Advisors in schools.


