Dear Parents and Carers,



SchoolTV's Dr Michael Carr-Gregg comes to Benalla to share his insights on how best to support students in returning to learning in this new post COVID safe environment.

He currently works in private practice in Melbourne and is the Commonwealth Government representative on the Board of the Australian Children's Television Foundation and is the Consultant Psychologist to Australian Boarding Schools Association. He joined SchoolTV in 2016 as a key presenter to help support parents in understanding the mental health and wellbeing challenges faced by young people today.
