Dear Parents and Carers,

It has been a busy but fabulous term. I know we have had many challenges, particularly to do with staffing, I am very appreciative of the support from the school community as we continue to navigate through this.

School Wide Positive Behaviours

School-wide positive behaviour support (SWPBS) is a framework that brings together school communities to develop positive, safe, supportive learning cultures. SWPBS assists schools to improve social, emotional, behavioural and academic outcomes for children and young people.

This week a team of staff from all campuses will meet with Cameron Furze, the Ovens Murray School-Wide Positive Behaviour Support Coach, to discuss how we can strengthen the use of SWPBS in our school. Around 20 staff have volunteered to work on the team and our first meeting was full of positive conversation on what SWPBS is, how well it works and how we can reinvigorate SWPBS in our school community. SWPBS is data driven and the strategies used in the school are set by the behaviours we are seeing at any given time. The team have set a few initial goals which include assessing where we currently are in regards to SWPBS in the school, reviewing our behaviour matrix, looking at developing small targeted lessons around our school values and expected behaviours in a variety of settings and revamping our rewards system. There will also be consultation with students in the development of some of these areas. Thanks to Kirsty Halligan for leading that team.

School for Student Leadership

The School for Student Leadership is a residential Government school program for Year 9 students which enables them to grow into better citizens and leaders through increased self-awareness, social engagement, community connection and environmental stewardship. We have had 5 students, Bronti Mustey, Max Harman, Molly Mathieson, Ryder Levy & Will Herbert- Jeffrey attend this term. Part of the program is for the students to produce a Community Learning Project (CLP). Last Friday Mr Alexander got to visit the campus and see their presentations in person (I got to watch online). Our students did a fabulous job presenting their project in a really engaging way. Their CLP, 'The Fishing Project', seeks to create a healthy ecosystem in our local Lake by eradicating carp.



This year, the camp will be held in person in the CBD from Monday, 26th June to Friday, 30th June, so students can experience the energy and excitement of being in the heart of Melbourne.

The Maths Camp is designed bring together high potential rural and regional students with a passion for STEM and mathematics and introduce them to the exciting opportunities available in mathematical industries. The MAV has partnered with four mathematical organisations, each of which will provide students with a challenging project investigation. Students will receive daily mentorship from mathematicians and industry experts, ensuring that they get the most out of their experience.

Throughout the camp, students will have the chance to develop **21st-century skills like communication, problem-solving, and creative and critical thinking** as they work in teams to build their project presentations and solutions. Social opportunities will also abound, giving students a chance to engage and collaborate with like-minded peers.

- Accommodation and all meals.
- All programmed activities, including: access to presentations from Industry representatives.
- Access to mentors who will work with students, including Mathematicians from tertiary sector.

Dear Parent,

Saver Plus helps to pay for education related items. Is your child in Primary School or High School? Would \$500 help cover the cost of education related items such as laptops or iPads?



You or someone you know may be eligible to join a local savings program and receive \$500 for education expenses.

Berry Street is delivering Saver Plus in your local area, and is currently looking for more people to join for the next exciting round.

Saver Plus is a 10-month program that can assist you to save for your own or your children's education expenses. Participants receive:

- One dollar in matched savings from ANZ for every dollar you save, up to \$500
- Free MoneyMinded financial education workshops, delivered online
- Personal support and guidance from a trusted community organisation

At the end of the program you can use your matched savings to purchase education-related items, such as a computer, laptop, school camps/excursions and textbooks.

To be eligible to participate in Saver Plus, you must:

- Be 18 years or over
- Be a parent or guardian of a student attending school, or be attending or returning to vocational training yourself
- Have a current Health Care card or Pensioner Concession card
- Have some form of income, for example, yourself or your partner may have casual, part-time, full-time, seasonal or cash-in-hand employment
- · Be in receipt of an eligible Commonwealth social security benefit, allowance or payment
