

School lunchboxes don't have to be complicated or crafty. What's important is that they contain a variety of foods from all <u>five food groups</u>, plus water to drink

Drinks to limit: fruit juice

Fruit juices have high levels of sugar and don't have much fibre. Children don't need extra sugar – but they do need fibre. That's why it's better for them to eat a piece of fruit, rather than drink juice.

If your child drinks juice, try to limit it to a $\frac{1}{2}$ cup per day. You could try giving fruit juice at a particular time or during a daily activity to help you stick to this limit. For example, you could say, 'We have fruit juice with our breakfast'. To make the $\frac{1}{2}$ cup of juice go further

In week five, nine Year 12 students went for a four-day camp to Bogong Outdoor School, where we were provided with information related to our Unit 3 studies. This included Australia before humans, and indigenous and colonial relationships with the land. We got to meet endemic animals, including Sugar Gliders and an Eastern Blue Tongue Lizard. We also took an overnight trip to Falls Creek and the Bogong High Plains, where we climbed Mount Cope and looked out over the Alpine National Park. We stopped at spots of scientific importance and old cattlemen's huts to learn about the history of the High Country and reflect on its ecological importance. Overall, it encompassed our entire first area of study, and apart from being very educational, it was a very good time!

FUTURE THINKERS




